Re: Ethics Complaint re Rep. Susan Wild (PA)

Dear Mr. Ashmawy,

The Foundation for Accountability and Civic Trust (FACT) is a nonprofit organization dedicated to promoting accountability, ethics, and transparency in government and civic arenas. We achieve this mission by hanging a lantern over public officials who put their own interest over the interests of the public good. We request the Office of Congressional Ethics investigate Representative Susan Wild for violating House ethics rules that forbid Members from using official taxpayer-funded resources for political purposes.¹

The Susan Wild campaign website includes multiple direct links to her official Member website.² For instance, an issue subpage on Wild's campaign website (located at https://wild-news/us-rep-susan-wild-upcoming-election-covid-19-response-and-movement-police-reform) links directly to her official website (located at: https://wild.house.gov/media/press-releases/rep-wild-statement-heroes-act). There are numerous instances of Wild's campaign linking to the taxpayer funded website as shown in Exhibit A.

House ethics rules require strict separation between campaign and official acts: a Member is prohibited from using official resources for campaign purposes³ and a Member is prohibited

from using campaign funds for official purposes.⁴ With respect to campaign websites, the ethics rules specifically state:

"Member campaign websites . . . may not include a link to the Member's House website; and The Member's House website may not be advertised on his or her campaign website or in materials issued by the campaign." 5

Wild has committed a clear violation by linking to her official congressional website on her campaign website. As a Member of the House, Wild is required to abide by **all** ethics rules and the House Ethics Manual.⁶ The foundational principal that Members cannot use their official position or resources for private or political gain is embodied throughout and in numerous specific rules.⁷ Moreover, in this case, the ethics rule is very clear and specific: Members are forbidden from using their campaign websites to link to their official taxpayer funded website. It is troubling when our Members cannot even follow the most basic and straightforward ethics rules. The Office of Congressional Ethics is responsible for ensuring each Representative fulfills the public trust inherent to the office and complies with the House's ethical standards. Therefore, we urge the Board to immediately investigate and stop Representative Wild's ongoing ethics violations related to her campaign website.

To the best of my knowledge and ability, all evidence submitted was not obtained in violation of any law, rule, or regulation. Further, I am aware that the False Statements Act, 18 U.S.C. § 1001, applies to information submitted to the Office of Congressional Ethics.

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According to her office, she has <u>legislation directing federal education and health officials</u> to encourage colleges to develop suicide prevention plans, make the suicide of a loved one a qualifying event for family members to enroll in or change an insurance plan so they have mental health coverage, and also an <u>amendment had was signed into law through the Older Americans Act</u> reauthorization to make pre-screening for suicidal thoughts mandatory for seniors entering long-term care. Last week, she rolled out a new bill to create 24/7 mobile crisis units to respond to mental health threats at the county level, in addition to funding crisis call lines and long-term mental health care.

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Wild has been in Congress since immediately after the 2018 election, when she was sworn-in to finish the term of retired U.S. Rep. Charlie Dant, the moderate Republican who represented Lehigh Yalley communities in Pennsylvanicis old 15th Congressional District.

Working with the Republican administration, Wild said she has seen successes and frustration. On the positive side, she worked to get protections against pharmaceutical monopolies included in the United States-Mexico-Canado Trade Agreement hailed by Trump as one of his top achievements. She also had two hills signed into law through the first coronavirus stimulus bill, the CARES Act, both to support seniors — one regarding meal delivery and one regarding in-home care.
